2017 JCSF Membership

I have enclosed a link of the CLUB MEMBERSHIP – <u>RENEWAL</u> APPLICATION http://www.jcsportfliers.org/PDF%20Files/Club_applicationREV12-2013%20(2).pdf. Please fill it out and bring it to the next meeting or mail it to me with a Self Addressed Stamped Envelope so that I can return a membership card to you. Please *circle any changes* to make it easier for me to update the files.

Unless you object, if your main phone number is now your cell phone it will be listed in our **Members Only** site. If you are **NOT** OK to put your cell phone number on our private site please note it on the renewal application for 2017.

Now that the AMA has changed the renewal from Jan 1st to Dec 31st to any consecutive 12 month period, it is necessary that we change our membership renewal policy. The exec board has decided that in order to renew your membership for the next year you must possess a valid AMA ID card with an expiration date of May 31st or after, for the year in which you are applying for club membership. So, in order for you to obtain a JCSF membership card you must have an AMA membership card that does not expire before May 31st of 2017.

The AMA is now sending all Club Officers an e-mail every month listing members in the club whose AMA membership has expired. Although we will attempt to remind you, it is your responsibility to renew your membership before it has expired. The JCSF **will not** be liable for any infractions of insurance liability. A **condition of your membership** is your current and **unabridged** yearly AMA membership participation.

As always, cash or checks are the only acceptable methods of membership payment. If you are already a member of our club you cannot prorate your yearly membership unless you pay the field fund fee again.

New JCSF Contest Bombs

Earlier this summer a few of us were talking after one of our fun fly contests where we had to use one of the club bomb devices, and we proposed that, perhaps, it would be cool to do an update to our traditional broomstick bombs and try a retro-modern approach. Retro— that they'd look like "real" 500lb bombs, and modern in that they'd be designed and made with modern techniques.

Since I can't sit still when a good idea is thrown down, I fired up AutoCAD and drew up a few proposals, which my "review board" checked out and provided feedback. The first idea—a two piece design, was OK but sat a little high on the bomb holder and the pin hole had to go through the fin surround (I was trying to keep the overall length the same as of the original bombs). Plus it required

adding lead shot to the hollow top.



Armed with feedback from my first attempt, I stretched the original design and made the fin surround square. This gave the bomb a more realistic look, allowed the pin holes to not have to pass through the fin surround, plus the bomb looked more realistic. Additionally, with this design I made the bottom of the bomb hollow, and the top solid, which essentially allowed me to print the nose weigh right into the bomb and keep the bomb as a one-piece design. And when I say "print" I meant using my **MakerGear 3D** printer to make up the bomb out of ABS plastic. The prototype was printed in gray plastic, but the "production" bombs will be printed in a bright plastic like orange to make them stand out at the field.

Recently Stu and Tom C. took the second prototype out to the field, where it performed quite well. With the hollow tail and pin holes the bomb had the added feature of whistling on its way back to terra firma. Nice! This design looks like a keeper, and the plan is to print up a new batch of bombs over the winter. Both Stu and Mark N. have 3D printers as well, so the plan is that the three of us will print out 5-6 bombs each for use in 2017. Be on the lookout for the new bombs—they'll be a blast (yeah, I know it's corny).

While the official 2017 club calendar won't be coming out until next month's edition of the newsletter, there are a few items of note that everyone should put on their calendars now so that you won't forget them...


Annual JCSF Club Dinner


AMA Expo East
