1. Rich Border Won with his Sig Senior Kadet. Rich used old school Ambroid Glue and covered with silk and dope. His electric powered bird weighs 9.5#





Rich also brought in this MIG-29. Built from a Hobby King Glue & Go Kit and uses a 3C for power.



2. Ken K. scratch built this F22 using 1/2" blue foam. It sports a 100A speed controller and 6C 4500 LiPO. Nice Job.



3. Gary S. built this 38" Hobby Lobby "Judge" 3D Edge 540. He powers it with a AXI 2212-26 motor.

Model of the Year

1. Gary won Model of the Year with his Aviacraft Panic designed by Robert Newman of Kent, UK. After winning Model of the month, Gary went on to take home the Best Sport Model Award at the Neat Fair. Gary had purchased one of these planes many years ago and enjoyed it so much that he wanted another one. When he tried to obtain another kit they not longer shipped to the US so he decided to use its remains to draw up a set of plans and build one himself. This 48" wingspan plane is illuminated with 530 LED's. The snap on struts provide power between the wings. He decided to cover each wing rib in chrome so that the light from the LED's would be reflected and diffused. A 50 mm motor propels this 4 1/2# plane. Gary added 3 1/2# of battery for balance bringing the all up weight to 7#. A 15-6 prop provides enough thrust for unlimited vertical performance.





2. Jake brought his Fun-51 bones in to win Project Night and then trucked the finished model back to win Model of the Month. Now he managed to come in 2nd for Model of the Year. With all of these pedigrees your Fun-51 is destined to win many fun -flys. Keep building Jake. 3. Rob K. calls his custom designed and built creation Hammerhead. This design uses a KMF-2 airfoil for lift and was fabricated with EPP foam and carbon fiber for reinforcement. Rob managed to imbed many LED's into the foam so that the airframe glows. 3D printed motor mounts support two 400 size motors spinning latex shredding 9" props.


