Warwick Electric Fly-In

The Bergen County Silent Fliers (BCSF) host an annual electric fly-in at the Warwick Airport in Warwick, NY, which is just under a two hour drive from central NJ. This low-key event is awesome in many ways. For one, they have both paved and grass runways, plus a lake from which to fly from! For some of us (present company included) this event was the first time we were able to fly off of water, which was a blast! Additionally they allow camping on-site, which is something we always like to take advantage of. Combine this together with a bunch of great guys from other clubs and you have a formula for a great weekend of flying and other fun.

While this event formally runs from Saturday to Sunday June 24-25, our club has the privilege of being part of the "setup crew", which means we can enter the airport on Friday afternoon. As I mentioned this event is at a full-scale airport so we're not allowed to start flying until operations shut down at 3pm on Friday, which is when we were allowed entry. However, we always had to keep our eyes open as more than once during the course of the weekend we had a full-scale plane use the runway, which meant we had to clear the air quickly. However this was always great to watch and no planes, big or small, were harmed.

As is the norm it appeared that the JCSF contingent outnumbered the host club in terms of members participating. Bad weather was forecast for Friday into Saturday, which scared off some pilots, but thankfully the storms came in overnight so when we awoke on Saturday the sky was clear blue, but the weather front left us with strong winds that delayed our flying that day. The norm for flying at this event is to fly from the lake in the AM and use the runway in the PM to avoid the sun, but with the winds we had to adjust our game plan. We ended up splitting our time in the afternoon between the lake and runway and had a great time at both locations. Gary S. thought enough to bring an inflatable raft to act as a recovery vehicle on the lake, and both Bob K. and Jake M. took advantage of it to try out Bob's new Coast Guard boat. As luck would have it we also needed a plane recovery while they were on the water, which they took care of admirably.

Possibly our favorite tradition at this event is to trek into the nearby town of Sugar Loaf on Saturday for dinner at the **Cancun Inn**. This restaurant serves authentic Mexican cuisine and the owner is a riot — never ceasing to amaze us with his slight-of-hand magic and gregarious nature. If you're in the area we heartily recommend checking it out!!!

On Sunday most of us had other commitments to get to so we packed up early and headed back to Jersey. I suggest marking your calendar for this event next year— it's definitely a great day trip or if you're interested in camping see me or one of the Exec Board members for more info. This contest is based loosely on the children's game, "Musical Chairs". Pilots circle the field and at random times set by the CD land and vie for "chairs" painted on the field with one less chair than pilot marked as "eligible". Points are awarded for each pilot successfully seated and then one chair and pilot removed until the last flight with only one chair and two pilots remain. Two rounds were flown and the cumulative points are used to determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners.
