
Model of the Month


Avro Lancaster Build Progress...

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, a group of us are building a small fleet of 74" Lancaster bombers. I thought a quick update might be of interest—if anyone wants more details of this build feel free to reach out me or one of the other build team members!

• At last month's meeting Mike C. showed off his first set of laser-cut parts for the wing. Bob K. has taken those and built his wing, as well as the tail assembly. He's making extremely good progress!



• I've been coming up to speed on Fusion 360 while drawing up the formers for the fuselage based on the original plans. I made one trial cut on my Shapeoko CNC— it's looking good so far!



• We decided to use Master Airscrew 9x7 three-bladed props for propulsion, and put in an order for twenty (ten left-handed and ten right-handed). These should work great with the Turnigy outrunners we're planning to use (D3530/14 1100 KVA). This should give us a bit over 1000W on a 3S Lipo.


