My Day with the NJ State Police Drone Team

On Wednesday October 18th, 2023 the NJ State Police Drone Team used our field to conduct Drone practice exercises for their members of the Drone Team. Tom C. and myself made arrangements to fly forgetting that the Drone team would be there that day. It was a beautiful day for flying. Sunshine and very little wind (2mph) made the conditions ideal for some RC plane flying. When I arrived at the field around 9:30am the Captain of the NJ State Police was already there. His name was Jordan and he was very interested in the model airplanes I had in my truck. We chatted a bit and he told me it was ok to fly as they would not be in the air until 11:30am. I told him I would like to hang around and be a spectator to see what they were going to do. I was also there to keep an eye out and report back to Dave Mauger as last year they had a problem with Earle radar. The team was very friendly and accommodating to Tom and myself. They let us inspect and photograph the drones with the laser IR cameras. They even showed us the amazing resolution and versatility of the drone cameras. At one point I mentioned that I had lost a plane in the brush and was unable to locate it. The team immediately directed all their drone flying into a search and recovery mission to find my missing plane. They looked at it as a challenge and gave a valiant effort using multiple drones and different camera techniques. They searched for hours but unable to find my lost plane. I thanked them immensely for their effort and time and invited them in to visit our field on a social occasion. Many of them were interested how we fly RC planes. All in all it was a great day at the field even though we didn't fly. It was a great experience meeting the team and learning about the technology used by the NJ State Police.

JCSF Bingo!

With the nasty weekend weather we've been having for the better part of the past two months I had my doubts that we'd be able to fit in another contest this fall, but to my surprise the weather on Sunday October 15th was actually dry! But Mother Nature wasn't quite done with us, for although she turned off the spigot she turned on the fans, and we had strong gusty winds at the field, but at least they were down the runway versus coming in over the trees.

And so I gathered up my supplies and headed off to the field to CD my contest—JCSF Bingo. It's actually a very straightforward landing and taxiing contest. You have four pieces of coroplast, each with a letter on it to spell out JCSF. There's a fifth piece of coroplast marked with an "X" that we use as the final parking location for the plane. The clock starts when you start taxiing away from the "J", take off and proceed to make a lap, land, and taxi over the "J". You then take back off again, make a lap, land, and taxi over the "C". Rinse and repeat two more times, then take off one more time, land, and park one of your main wheels on the X and you are done. Oh, but I forgot, there's the dice roll. Since I like to try and even the odds with our pilots I added a dice roll to the contest. Before you take off you had to roll two dice (using my phone app) and record the number. Then at the end of your flight you needed to roll the same number again, and only once you did that would the timer stop. This adds the chance component to the fun.

We had six pilots sign up for the contest despite the blustery conditions, and with the winds we opted to fly one round for a winner -take-all approach. We had three guys roll snake eyes, which as you'd imagine largely wreaked havoc with their times. Tom C. started the contest with a great flight time, but it took him over a minute and a half to roll snake eyes, and honestly the app made it quicker than if we had physical dice. From there we moved our way down the list, with Stan being the second to last pilot to fly. Stan had also rolled snake eyes earlier and so we figured we'd see a repeat of what the others went through with this combo. Stan had a great flight, and when done he jogged over to the pits to start rolling the dice. One throw, and he nailed snake eyes!!! Honestly, as much as I trust Stan I might have had given him some grief if I hadn't seen it for myself, but damn it was for real. Stan snagged an overall time of 3:12, easily besting the previous best time of 3:57 which was done by Mike C. After that Dave opted to bow out as the wind was getting worse and there was just no catching Stan at that point.

We had a great time, and no planes were lost in the contest. Jason did manage to knock the motor off of his Stick, but that was after his round was complete and he was horsing around. Because the conditions were so questionable we didn't have lunch this time around, but it was still a lot of fun!
