After rambling on for a few more minutes, I realized that everyone wasn't paying attention to me, but rather the delicious smelling spread next to me. Streamer Chase!!!

Well, I'm happy to report that we were able to get in a club contest this month! Although the weather didn't cooperate 100%, we were able to get in the competition, despite the fact that water and crept paper don't mix...

On Saturday July 19th we held our rescheduled Streamer Chase. When I arrived at the field it was pointed out to me that the grass was wet, which is normally a no-no for this contest. But conditions seemed to be improving, as it was a bit breezy and that was helping to dry out the grass. I did a quick drag test with a streamer to see if it would get too wet—the results were good and we decided to move forward as planned.

We had a total of seven pilots ready to engage in battle. As I was covering for Mike K. in the CD role (he had to work), I offered up to the pilots a rules change. Normally for combat we fly up to four planes at a time, but today I was feeling frisky and suggested we fly all seven planes at once. Typically this is not an option, but this Saturday we had the park all to ourselves, so that took away a major risk factor. On top of that, despite the forecast the sky did look a bit threatening, so shortening the event wasn't a bad idea. The pilots looked at each other, shrugged their shoulders, and said why not...

As it turned out shortening the contest wasn't a bad idea, as after the first round we started to get a light on and off drizzle. Not enough precipitation to halt the contest, or ruin the streamers, but enough to let us know more rain was likely on the way. We held three two-minute rounds of combat, which was definitely more fun for both pilots and spectators with more planes in the air. After the third round I collected the score sheets and tallied the results.

Not surprisingly, Tom C. took top honors, making three cuts with the only glow-powered plane in the contest. In a very strong second place was Dave M., who made two cuts, with one via a rather small foamy P-47. Dana H. took third when he made a cut in the final round with his HB2 combat plane. I mentioned at the field that there were no causalities in the event, but I did overlook Stu's plane having its elevator clipped during the contest, and ending up near the weeds. However it did return for some post-contest action.

With the contest complete we moved over to the pavilion and had a nice lunch of Jersey Mike's subs and sodas. Shortly afterwards the real rain showed up, and we quickly packed up our stuff and hit the road. It felt great to get in a contest, and I'm hopeful that we'll get in a lot more as we move into the second half of this summer.


