## 2026 Brass Monkey

So Adam broke out his stop watch, and we took turns "flying". And I say "flying" as it was more like trying to keep your plane in the air in a semi-controlled fashion. Thankfully everyone who flew kept their planes in one piece.

Since the object of the contest was to survive, Adam decided that the Brass Monkey winner would be done by the luck of the draw, which gave all of us an equal chance. As fate would have it, the most skilled pilot flying— Tom C.—also had luck on his side this day and he took home the Brass Monkey. As I mentioned in a previous edition of The Transmitter, Stan B. gifted the club his collection of old-school Brass Monkey prizes, so Tom got the "real thing".

To no one's surprise, once the contest wrapped up we all made a quick exit from the field to warm up. It was a great way to kick off the year, and it was fun seeing everyone. I was very proud to reply that our guys flew— wind be damned ;)



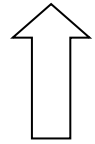
